Scenes like these show us that all is not well in our oceans.

Marine scientists have discovered that many plastics that find their way into the world's oceans are toxic.



This means that these plastics can damage the animals and even kill them.

Another problem is that wildlife such as seabirds can get entangled in bits of plastic or even become stuck in plastic bottles.







Fortunately, scientists, marine conservation societies and the UK government agree that we need to do more to protect our seas and oceans, particularly where the use of plastic is concerned.

They suggest that we can all take some action – even if it is something as simple as taking home our rubbish after a day out.

I am also sure that you will remember many ways that you reduce the impact that plastics can have on the environment such as,

having a reusable water bottle rather than relying on a single-use one and taking a reusable bag with you when you go to the shops, rather than paying for single-use plastic one.
